Susan Mosier is the secretary and state health officer for the Kansas Department of Health and Environment. She continues to serve as the state's Medicaid director, a role she has held since March 2012. She is a fellow of the Medicaid Leadership Institute. She is board-certified in ophthalmology and had a solo medical and surgical ophthalmology practice in Manhattan, Kansas, from 2000-2012. In 2010, she was elected to the Kansas House of Representatives and served there until she took the position of Medicaid director.

Prior to her medical career, Mosier was a systems development and database manager at the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC) from 1988-1990. At the NAIC, Mosier oversaw projects to update and improve the information technology systems and databases that support the states and territories in regulating the insurance industry. Previously she worked as a project leader for American Airlines from 1986-1988 where she directed the work of supervisors and programmer/analysts in the design and implementation of a new budget system. She served as a consultant in Arthur Andersen & Co.'s Management Information Consulting Division from 1983-1986.

Mosier graduated summa cum laude from Kansas State University with a bachelor's degree in pre-medicine. She received her Master of Business Administration degree from the University of Texas at Austin with an emphasis in accounting and information systems. She received her Doctor of Medicine degree from the University of Kansas and completed her residency training in ophthalmology at the University of Iowa.
