There is growing recognition in the United States that health and wellness are significantly affected by factors outside of the traditional healthcare and public health delivery systems. To maximize opportunities to improve population health, leaders from both spheres can focus on aligning partners whose work touches on the factors that impact community and individual health: built environment, social connection, behavioral health patterns, and clinical interventions. The Center aims to position S/THOs as chief health strategists in their jurisdictions who can align partners toward a shared vision of community wellness and generate resources for health. Activities may include:

- Strengthening collaboration and integration between payers, providers, and public health agencies.
- Addressing the social determinants of health and health equity in programs and health services supported by public health agencies, healthcare providers, public and private payers, and health systems across rural and urban communities.
- Enhancing state and local capacity for using health data and informatics.

WHAT DOES THE CENTER FOR POPULATION HEALTH STRATEGIES OFFER?



The Center develops tools to help state and territorial public health agencies maximize limited resources through cross-sector and cross-agency collaboration and use existing resources and skills to most effectively target public health interventions.



The Center collaborates with public health and healthcare stakeholders, as well as multi-sector public and private thought leaders. ASTHO's staff, ASTHO's Board of Directors, and multi-sector advisory committee (the Population Health Forum) collectively serve as your network of population health experts and stand ready to assist you in your leadership and population health transformation journey.



The Center is a platform for ASTHO's members to share their successes and drive conversation across states and territories to craft solutions and policies that enhance collaboration, increase the uptake of prevention and evidence-based strategies that improve health outcomes, and address the non-medical determinants of health. This includes opportunities to engage in the my.ASTHO online community around how you and other members are improving population health in your jurisdictions.
