KY	HB 416	Requires health facilities to implement infection prevention programs; requires health facilities to report to the cabinet data on HAI and MDRO infections using NHSN or other data collection system approved by the cabinet. The cabinet will make appropriate data available on its website. Established penalties for violations.	Not passed
NJ	SB 142	Requires general hospitals, comprehensive rehabilitation hospitals, and nursing homes to establish written infections prevention and control policies and report all incidents of MRSA and VRE to the Department of Health and Senior Services.	Not passed*
NJ	AB 2189/ SB 149	Amends current law; requires hospitals to implement MRSA infection prevention programs in all units except inpatient psychiatric units.	Not passed*
NY	SB 2181	Establishes a coordinated statewide policy, investigation, and reporting requirements with respect to infections, including certain staphylococcus infections. Creates the New York state interagency task force on research, services, screening, and education concerning staphylococcus and other infections, whose purpose shall be to establish a coordinated plan and policy concerning staphylococcus infections and other infections. Members of the task force shall require immediate notification within an affected facility where there is an occurrence of MRSA or VRE.	Not passed
NY	AB 8937/ SB 2828	Requires physicians to report instances of MRSA infections to the commissioner of health.	Not passed
TN	HB 3356/ SB 3529	Requires the department to report annually to committees of the legislature on the risks of community-associated MRSA infections.	Not passed
