#### **Council Introductions**

#### **“Extended School Day Act of 2011”**

**Introducer:** Alexander

**Co-sponsor:** Barry

**Purpose:** This bill would extend the school day from 6.5 hours to 7.5 hours.

**Committee Referral:** Committee of the Whole

**Potentially Impacted Agency:** DME, DCPS, OSSE

#### **“Maximum Class Size Act of 2011”**

**Introducer:** Alexander

**Co-sponsor(s):** None

**Purpose:** This bill would limit to 20 the maximum number of students in classes in the District of Columbia.

**Committee Referral:** Committee of the Whole

**Potentially Impacted Agency:** DME, OSSE, DCPS

**“Mosquito Prevention and Abatement Amendment Act of 2011”**

**Introducer:** Bowser

**Co-sponsor:** None

**Purpose:** This bill would require the Mayor to develop and implement a plan to reduce and abate mosquitos in the District of Columbia.

**Committee Referral:** Health

**Potentially Impacted Agency:** DDOE, DOH

**“Reimbursable Detail Expansion and Promoter Regulation Act of 2011”**

**Introducer:** Evans

**Co-sponsors:** M.Brown and Mendelson

**Purpose:** Would amend the D.C. Code to require participation in the reimbursable detail program by alcoholic beverage control licensed nightclubs and licensed establishments with entertainment endorsements that stay open after 11:59 p.m.; and establish a law directing ABRA to promulgate rules to regulate individuals and businesses that engage in the promotion of events which occur at licensed establishments and last until after 11:59 p.m.

**Potentially Impacted Agency:** MPD, ABRA

**“District Resident Workforce Incentive Amendment Act of 2011”**

**Introducers:** M. Brown, Chairman Brown, Catania and Evans

**Co-sponsors:** Cheh, Barry, Orange, Alexander, Evans, Graham, Bowser, Mendelson and Wells

**Purpose:** The legislation creates a tax incentive for companies which conduct business in the District and whose workforce is largely made up of D.C. residents, and provides further tax incentives if those companies employ hard to employ residents (e.g., chronically unemployed, TANF recipients, etc.).

**Committee Referral:** Finance and Revenue

**Potentially Impacted Agency:** OTR, DOES

**“Sense of the Council to Amend Federal Rule of Criminal Procedure 16 Resolution of 2011”**

**Introducer:** Orange

**Co-sponsor(s):** None

**Purpose:** A Sense of the Council resolution to request amendments to Federal Rule of Criminal Procedure 16 to require timely disclosure for exculpatory evidence well before trial. There is currently no time requirement for evidence that has not been determined to be material.

**Committee Referral:** Retained by the Council; under advisement by Judiciary

**Potentially Impacted Agency:** USAO

**“Firearms Amendment Act of 2011”**

**Introducer:** Mendelson

**Co-sponsor:** Chairman K. Brown

**Purpose:** This bill would propose a number of proposed changes to gun registration law to simplify registration and conditions (ballistics, vision test, frequency of requirement of training and acknowledgement of district laws).

**Committee Referral:** Judiciary

**Potentially Impacted Agency:** MPD

**“Judicial Declaration of Parentage Act of 2011”**

**Introducer:** Mendelson

**Co-sponsor:** None

**Purpose:** This bill would provide for judicial declaration of parentage for children born in the District to parents who live outside the District.

**Committee Referral:** Judiciary

**Potentially Impacted Agency:** DOH, OAG, Courts

**“Fire and Emergency Medical Services Employee Presumptive Act of 2011”**

**Introducer:** Mendelson

**Co-sponsor:** Cheh, Catania, Evans, Orange, Thomas

**Purpose:** This bill would modify the current status quo in which an employee at FEMS who is diagnosed with certain diseases and injuries is automatically presumed to have gotten it as part of their normal duties.

**Committee Referral:** Judiciary

**Potentially Impacted Agency:** FEMS, MPD

**“Neighborhood Contractor Daytime Parking Amendment Act of 201”**

**Introducer:** Wells

**Co-sponsors:** Catania, Bowser and Mendelson

**Purpose:** The legislation would allow contractors to purchase permits at a cost of \$500/annually to authorize weekday parking from 8am-5pm for workers in neighborhoods.

**Committee Referral:** Environment, Public Works and Transportation

**Potentially Impacted Agency:** DMV, DPW, MPD

**“Sustainable Bottle Amendment Act of 2011”**

**Introducer:** Wells

**Co-sponsor(s):** None

**Purpose:** Would amend DC Code to allow the sale of reusable bottles, otherwise known as “growlers,” for small business breweries in the District.

**Potentially Impacted Agency:** ABRA

**“Sense of the Council Support for D.C. United Soccer Remaining in the District of Columbia Resolution of 2011”**
